

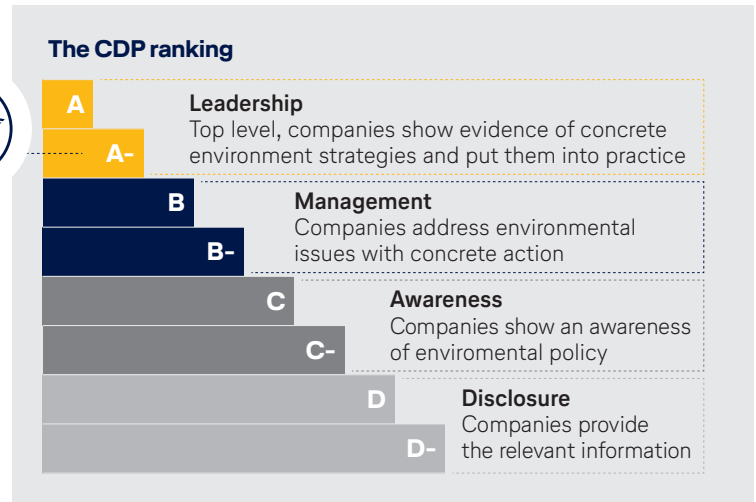

# TOP MARKS FOR THE LUFTHANSA GROUP

In the global climate ranking for 2022 of the non-profit organisation CDP, the Lufthansa Group received top marks for its CO<sub>2</sub> reduction strategy and its implementation. LHG improved on the previous year, moving up from B to A-. This makes the Lufthansa Group one of the Top 5 airlines worldwide with the best grades.



Each year, CDP gathers information on CO<sub>2</sub> emissions sustainability strategies and sustainability goals from more than 18,700 companies. In environmental reporting, their climate ranking is considered the gold standard worldwide. CDP is a partner of the independent Science Based Targets Initiative (SBTi).

# MoU SIGNED

Worldwide, the demand for sustainable aviation fuels (SAF) is increasing dramatically. The Lufthansa Group is one of the drivers of this development: No other airlines group in Europe uses more SAF. In addition, the company has also been involved in innovative SAF research projects for some years now.

The most recent milestone: At the beginning of February, the Lufthansa Group and the Swiss Energy Group VARO Energy signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) for the production and supply of SAF. According to this MoU, large quantities of SAF can be supplied as early as 2026, including supplies to the Munich hub. VARO and the Lufthansa Group are also pushing ahead with innovative processes to manufacture green hydrogen from biogenic waste materials.
